

Medical Volunteer Responsibilities

The purpose of a medical volunteer is to provide medical attention to any volunteers or visitors to the Tabernacle Experience. All medical volunteers must be currently certified in CPR by AHA, Red Cross, or other recognized organization.

General Information:

- First Aid supplies are found in the First Aid Bin
- Set up and occupy the First Aid Station
- Obtain a blue radio for communication with Security and Safety

In the event of an Medical Problem:

- Provide First Aid as necessary
 - Very basic wound care (Band-aids and Bacitracin)
 - Sunscreen
 - Low Blood Sugar
 - Etc.
- In case of a medical emergency, call 911
 - Perform Basic Life Support measures
 - Provide emotional support
 - Provide information to medical responders
- Collect the following information on the provided form:
 - Patient
 - Name
 - Age
 - Phone #
 - Address
 - Bishop (If known)
 - Phone Number
 - Ward (If known)
 - Witnesses
 - Names
 - Phone #s

- Brief Medical Report
 - Describe the nature of the injury or illness and treatment provided
- For minor incidents report the incident to online at:
